

# Mystery in the Southwest

## A Three-Fabric Throw

Finished size: 53" x 53"

Fabric	Option #1: Solids, tonals, or "basic" batik (recommended)	Option #2: Solids, tonals, or "basic" batik (recommended)	Option #3: One print and two coordinating fabrics	Yardage
<b>A</b>	Light	Light	Light	1 1/4
<b>B</b>	Dark	Light/Medium	Print/Focus Fabric	2
<b>C</b>	Bright	Dark	Dark	1 1/8
	This option gives lots of contrast and a distinct Southwest feel.	Suggest all in the same color family for a more subtle quilt design, but still Southwest.	This option will not have the Southwest feel of #1 or #2	

WOF = Width of fabric

All seams 1/4"

Press to the dark side unless otherwise noted

## Clue #4

### Center Block (make 1)

**Cutting** (use leftover fabric from initial cutting)

Fabric C: (1) 2 1/2" square

Fabric A: (4) 2 1/2" x 1 1/2" rectangle; (2) 3 1/4" squares

Fabric B: (4) 2 1/2" x 1 1/2" rectangle; (2) 3 1/4" squares

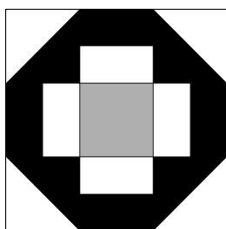
Sew A and B rectangles together to create (4) 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" units.

Press toward darker fabric.

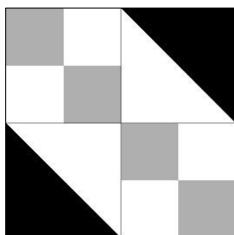
Using instructions from Step #2, make (4) half-square triangle units using the 3 1/4" A and B squares

Trim down to measure 2 1/2" X 2 1/2".

Arrange and sew the Center Block units to create this block.



Using the four patch and half-square triangle units from clues 1 and 2, make (12) blocks that look like this.



Now you have a full week to play with your blocks and try to solve the mystery!
